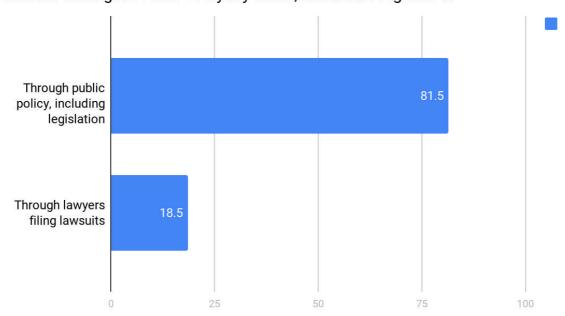
The following is a summary of the results of a Google Survey written by and conducted for the U.S. Chamber Institute for Legal Reform (ILR), on issues related to U.S. consumer attitudes towards lawsuits and innovation. The survey consisted of over 1,500 respondents and was weighted by Google to create a representative sample of the U.S. consumer population. The survey was conducted March 22-25, 2018.

Nearly 82% of U.S. consumers say emerging technologies should be regulated by public policy, not lawsuits.

How do you think emerging technologies, such as products that incorporate artificial intelligence into everyday tasks, should be regulated?

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Methodology:
